Business Arising

Congregational Development

- We will be maintaining a separate Stewardship Team. Thank you to Donna for chairing.
- There will be a new diocesan Archdeacon for rural ministry. The portfolio is to include stewardship and congregational development. The Ven. Nancy Beale will be developing this role as of December 6.
- Very good discussions were held at the approach meals.

Outreach

- \$1000 will be sent to PWRDF for aid to Gaza hospitals.
- Coalition of Angels There are currently 29 families on the list and 10 to 12 more are expected to be added.
- A thank you card was received from Rideau District High School for assistance with one of their families.
- The Athens Ministerial is hosting a fundraiser for Mapleview Landings in April 2024. \$2000 will be donated to this effort.
- Sweet's Corners Elementary School will need more funding for its nutrition program in the spring.
- We are applying for a diocesan Stretch grant for a truth and reconciliation initiative. Consider other suggestions for 2024. Something for schools?
- Epiphany jug campaign We will try a virtual campaign. Receipts issued for donations of \$20 or more. For school nutrition programs at Sweet's Corners, Rideau District, and South Crosby Public School. Parish will match funds up to \$5000. Promote on social media and with a media release, and through the schools and the Seeley's Bay Area Residents Association.

Stewardship & Financial

- Financial statements Agapa gala transactions were under fundraising but were moved out to do the green sheets. Enough income was left to cover expenses. Extra income was moved to the Outreach category. This was done in order to avoid assessment, as they become designated funds.

- We have a mechanism for transferring funds to the diocese without writing a cheque. Mary suggests we use this to send funds for the McDonald estate that went to the Anglican Foundation.

- Consider hosting a town hall meeting to discuss affordable housing.
